Even if you are not eligible for federal student aid, you may still be eligible for aid from your state or college.
- "3" means you are not eligible for federal student aid for this school year unless you complete an acceptable drug rehabilitation program or pass two unannounced drug tests administered by an acceptable drug rehabilitation program.
