

Summer Withdrawal Policy

A student is considered withdrawn if the student ceases attendance at any point prior to completing one of the Summer Session periods, unless the student provides written notification that s/he will attend a summer session that begins later in the Summer term.

If a student withdraws during a summer session, their financial aid will be prorated based on the number of days attended. The student must notify the Summer Session Office of their intent to withdraw. This date of notification to the Summer Session Office is the effective date used in recalculating financial aid eligibility. Students will be billed for the funds they are no longer eligible to receive. If the withdrawal date occurs after 60% of the session has elapsed, aid will not be adjusted. Refer to the chart below to determine if any action is required for your withdrawal from Summer Session.

If you do not attend Session II, your aid will be revised based on the original withdrawal date and you may be billed.
	and does not plan to remain enrolled for Session II.	NO. Your aid will be revised based on the number of days attended.
Only session(s) that begin(s) June 25th	and enrolls in Session II at the same time of the withdrawal from any of prior sessions	NO. You will maintain summer aid as long as you enroll in at least 6 units in Session II
Only Session II	Not Applicable	NO. If you withdraw from Session II, your aid will be revised based on the number of days attended.

If you receive all F's in a Summer Session, the withdrawal calculation is done based on the midpoint of the session unless written documentation is received from your professor stating you earned your F. You will be notified by email if this is the case.
